The 5 major approaches of pedagogy learning are-

Constructivist - Instead of only taking information passively, this method involves engaging the pupils in the process of comprehending and learning. Collaborative - Here, the students establish learning teams that collaborate to address issues, develop concepts, produce goods, or finish tasks. The pupils worked together intellectually on this, either among themselves or with the aid of the professors.

Integrative - The students are offered a learning environment for the integrated approach that enables them to connect with their learning throughout the curriculum. The four integration goals are as follows:

- 4. Associating the concepts in regular lives

Inquiry-Based Learning - In the inquiry-based learning approach, teachers are required to do more than just respond to students' questions; they must also foster an environment in which students' ideas are challenged, developed, and perfected.
